The innovation of this animation is that "Landscape Love" is shot against the original background and combined with frame-by-frame animation shots [2]. In the climax of "Farewell", the artist painted on the spot and the photographer shot on the spot, and then synthesized with the animation lens, so that the short film fully demonstrates the sense of layering and rhythm brought by the artists' pen and ink. Such innovation is a level that is difficult for modern animation to reach.

What "Deep Sea" wants to do is to use modern animation production technology to express the flowing and elegant characteristics of Chinese ink paintings. Of course, the colors are no longer black and white, but gorgeous and colorful. For this reason, the production team used countless particles to pile up into ink shapes and become For all kinds of concrete things, the number of particles in a single frame alone is hundreds of millionsb [3].

This animated film uses the form of ink painting to express an underwater world full of fantasy colors. Under the shell of fantasy adventure, it carries the discussion of life and inter-

prets the theme of finding comfort and warming others in the lonely journey of the soul. The film not only reaches an astonishing level in terms of visual effects, but also gives new meaning and value to ink animation in terms of emotional depth and cultural connotation.
